

## Nephrology specific Portfolio<sup>1</sup>

CV<sup>2</sup>, including education, work experience [no gaps], awards, scholarly activities [papers published; papers presented: oral, posters; abstracts published (not otherwise presented)]; grants or contract funding.

### Educational activities

- Courses, meetings attended.
- Presentations given, e.g. renal grand rounds, fellows' conference; residency curriculum; medical student teaching; other [in-service at dialysis].
  - The PowerPoint and bibliography should be saved in entirety.

### Logs

- Consults. Transplant lists. Procedures, including biopsies, central catheter placement, apheresis supervised, interventional experiences.

### Clinical Questions

- May reference particular patient or identify problem, research results, analysis of impact.

### QI projects

Evaluations, test results, including in-service and certifying exams.

Reflections, including goals, objectives and progress.

- Fellows are urged to do this semi-annually. Self-reflection is mandatory when evaluations reveal marginal [for example, 4 on annual ABIM 9 point Likert scale review] or unsatisfactory performance, or at request of program director.

Review various CVs to find clear, crisp format – consider checking with promotion committee of department or school. Review with Program Director to make sure it emphasizes issues related to career goals.
