- Why did ASN decide to transition from an in-person meeting to a digital meeting? The ASN Council, City of Denver, and State of Colorado agreed that it is in the best interests of all involved not to hold Kidney Week in-person this fall.
- 2. What are the dates of Kidney Week Reimagined?
 - October 19-21, 2020 for Early Programs live-streamed and on-demand content.
 - October 22-25, 2020 for the <u>Annual Meeting</u> simulive, live-streamed, and on-demand sessions; posters; and exhibits.
 - All meeting content will be available on the Kidney Week Reimagined website until December 4, 2020.

3. What is the time zone of Kidney Week Reimagined?

The simulive and live-streamed educational content will be scheduled between 9:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. Eastern Daylight Time (EDT) in the United States. All content will be recorded and made available on-demand within one hour.

4. What does Kidney Week Reimagined include?

- Registration for an <u>Early Program (October 19-21)</u> includes interactive, live sessions daily and access to all recorded presentations for that program for up to three years.
- Registration for the <u>Annual Meeting (October 22-25)</u> includes plenaries, 100+ sessions (simulive, live-streamed, and on-demand), posters, exhibits, networking, and more. All meeting content will be available on the Kidney Week Reimagined website until December 4, 2020. In January 2021, this content will move to the ASN Learning Center for up to three years and continue to be complimentary to meeting participants who obtain an access code. Access code information will be available in October.

Some educational sessions will be live-streamed, others will be pre-recorded with live chat/Q&A with faculty (i.e., simulive), and others will be pre-recorded and available on-demand. The live-streamed and simulive sessions will be recorded and made available on-demand within one day.

9. How long will I have access to the recorded content?

All meeting content will be available on the Kidney Week Reimagined website until December 4, 2020. In January 2021, this content will move to the ASN Learning Center for up to three years and continue to be complimentary to meeting participants who obtain an access code.
